Dear Majority Leader McConnell, Minority Leader Reid, Chairman Murkowski and Ranking Member Cantwell,

On behalf of our respective organizations, we write to urge you to permanently reauthorize the Federal Land Transaction Facilitation Act (FLTFA) as soon as possible, in order to reinstate a critical western lands bill that facilitates strategic federal land sales and supports protecting our nation's special places. FLTFA reauthorization is included in the Murkowski-Heinrich Bipartisan Sportsmen's Act of 2015 (S. 405), and Senators Heinrich and Heller recently introduced standalone FLTFA reauthorization legislation (S. 2189). We appreciate the Committee's leadership to advance FLTFA and urge the Senate to swiftly pass permanent FLTFA reauthorization on any legislative vehicle opportunities.

FLTFA is a common-sense lands tool that achieves economic and conservation goals. Originally enacted in 2000 (P.L. 106-248), FLTFA is a western federal lands program that facilitates strategic federal land sales by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in order to provide funding for high-priority land conservation within or adjacent to federal lands in the eleven contiguous western states and Alaska. Without FLTFA, BLM has little capacity to sell land; the public-private "checkerboard" of lands in the

West remains frozen; and counties, communities, ranchers, businesses, landowners and others are often unable to buy BLM lands identified for disposal through an efficient mechanism. Without FLTFA, BLM has very limited funding to conduct sales and other administrative real estate work, but if FLTFA is reauthorized, a portion of FLTFA proceeds will fund these costs and increase BLM staff capacity.

The sales revenue generated is deposited into the Federal Land Disposal Account, which provides funding for BLM, USFS, NPS, and USFWS land conservation projects that increase public access for outdoor recreation, hunting, and fishing; conserve wildlife habitat; protect water quality; and preserve historic and cultural resources. The purchases often enhance the tourism and recreation economies of local communities through retail sales, hotels, restaurants, gas stations and more. Without FLTFA, revenue from sales of BLM lands goes directly to the U.S. Treasury and not to conservation. These FLTFA land sales and acquisitions provide a critical tool for consolidating private and public land ownership, which allows for more efficient land management and expanded business operations.

Please reauthorize FLTFA as soon as possible, to provide benefits for local economies, communities, agencies, conservation and the West. As FLTFA reauthorization moves forward, we look forward to working with you and your staff.
